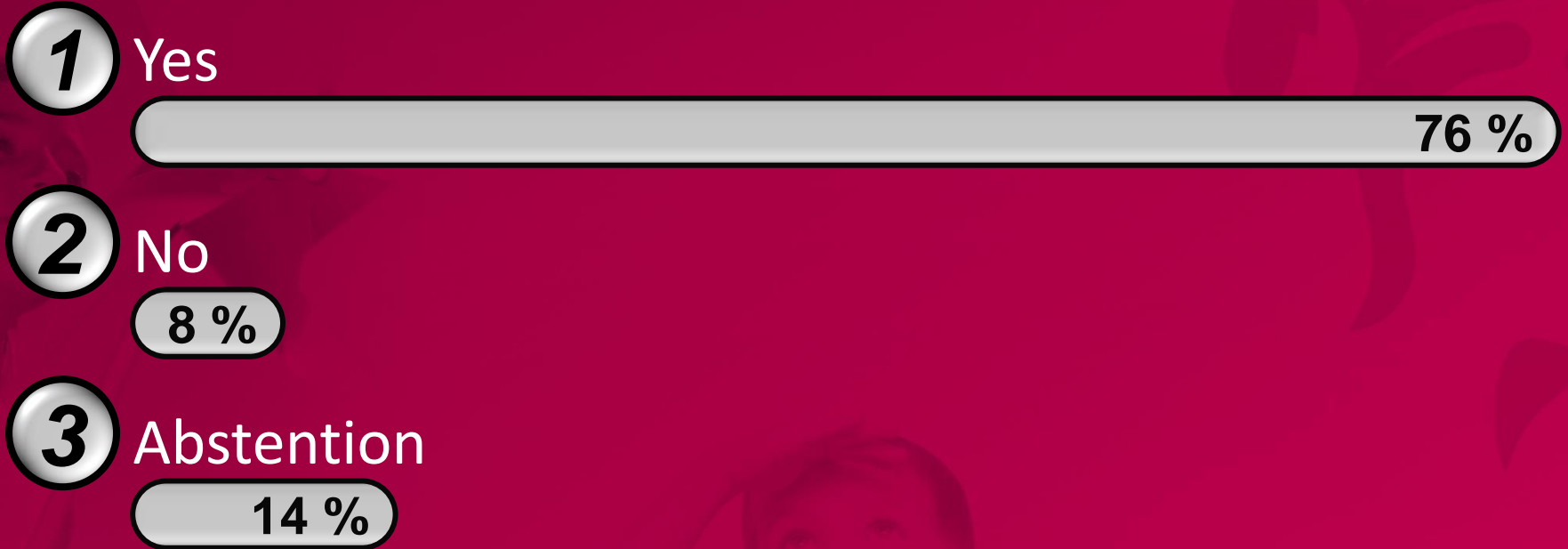

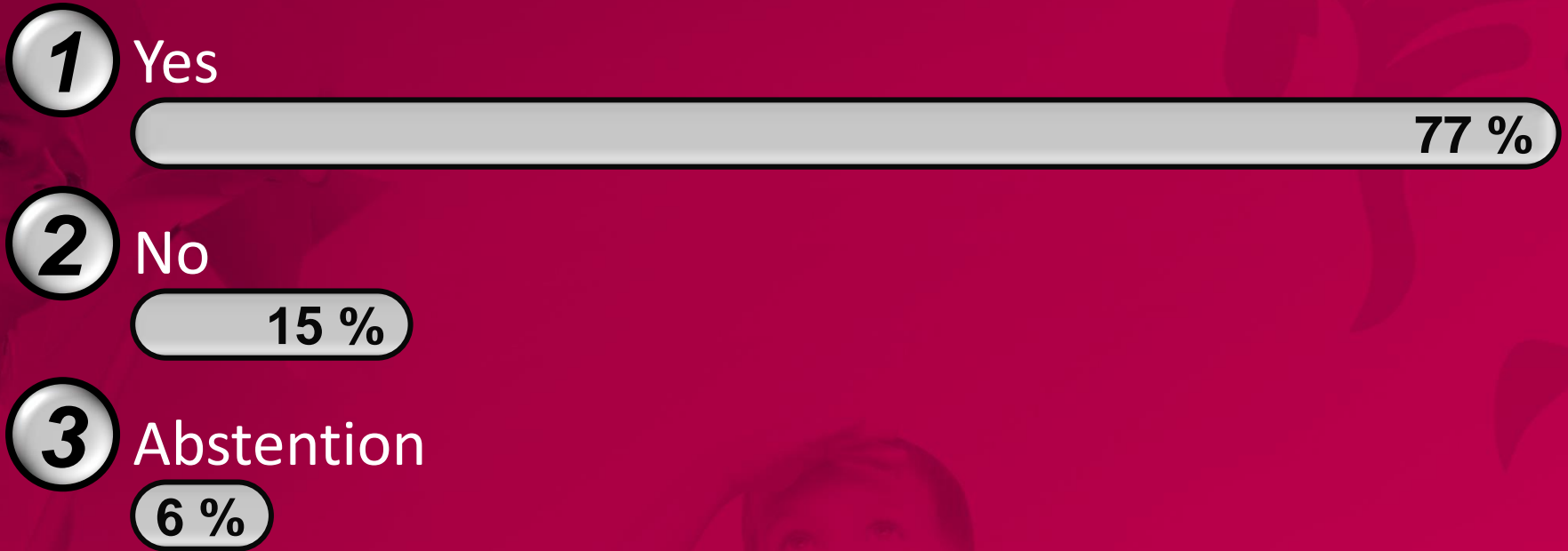


PRESIDENTIAL STATEMENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY - GA/2/14/2.1

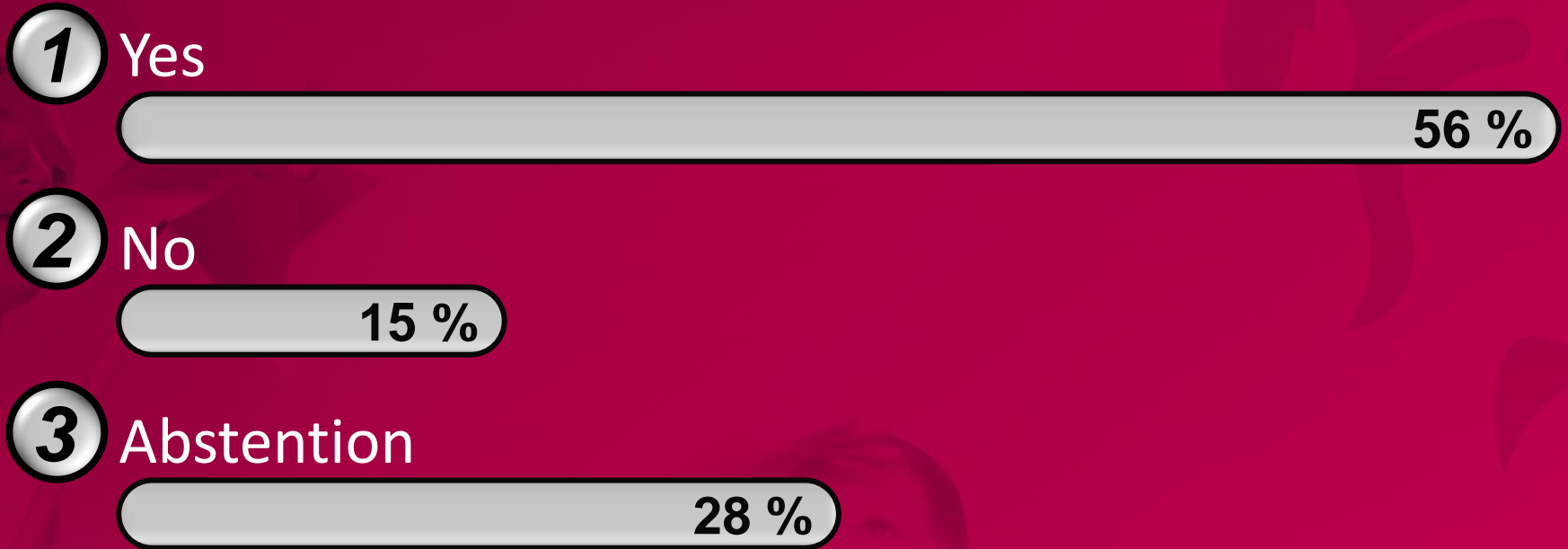


PRESIDENTIAL STATEMENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY - GA/3/14/3.1

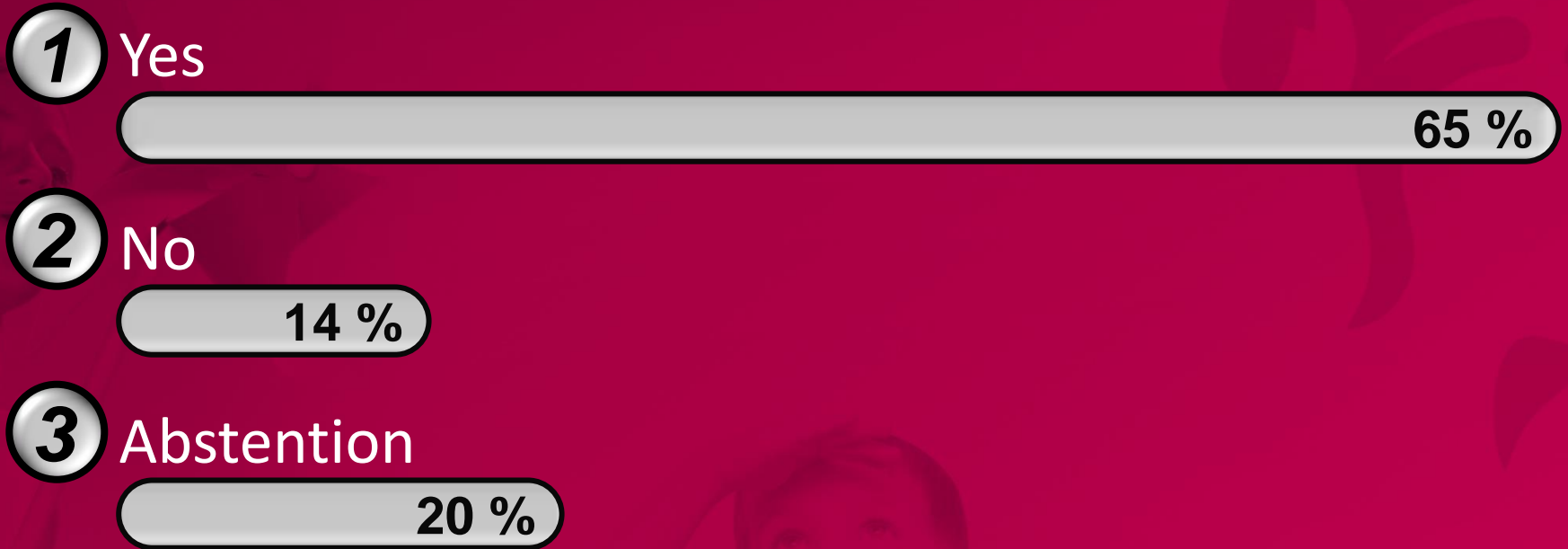


PRESIDENTIAL STATEMENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY - GA/4/14/4.1
